### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

### Conditions for safe storage, including any incompatibilities

Keep away from oxidizing agents and from highly acidic or alkaline materials. Do not smoke. Once the containers are open, they must be carefully closed and placed vertically to prevent spills.
